

Fellowship Community Groups Discussion Guide
March 29, 2020

Leaders: If you are using the free version of Zoom, you will be limited to 40 minutes per session. **My suggestion is to close the meeting at 35 minutes, restart a “New Meeting”, and send a group text to your group with the code so they can “Join Meeting”.** It should only take a couple minutes and then you have a fresh 40 minutes.

Introduction from the Leader:

- Welcome to our online format! Please schedule this time each week.
- For video conference discussion, give a little extra time before speaking. If too many people talk at once, it can get hard to understand.
- Be in a quiet room, and use the mute feature if ANY background noise.
- Talk about restarting a second meeting and how that will work (see above).

Opening Questions:

1. Have each person take a minute to share how they are doing during this time. Are they working? Are they healthy? Do they have any needs the church can help with?

2. Go around the screen, and each person share something they did this week that they enjoyed.

Into the Text : Everyone open your bibles to Acts 4:32-37. Let’s have some general discussion on the whole passage for several minutes. What do you see that stands out to you about this early church community.

Then shift to Acts 5:1-11. Take a minute to read it, and discuss what was so bad about what Ananais and Sapphira did. What else do you notice in this passage?

Application: As you think about this passage, what are the things you think God would want us to apply to our lives? What warnings should we take to heart? What are your takeaways from this week’s message and worship service?

Prayer time: Ask for a volunteer to open, and a volunteer to close. Spend some time praying, one at a time. This is a critical time of spiritual community during this challenging time of separation.
